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# LABRADOR'S NEW WALK

The 2.1 km Labrador Nature and Coastal Walk is the latest trail to open to nature lovers. Visitors can enjoy the flora, fauna and also a beautiful view of the sea.

There are many starting points to the nature walk. For a more relaxing time, you can start at Harbourfront MRT station and make your way towards Labrador Park station using the marked out route.

The walk towards Henderson Waves can be quite challenging. Bring water.

The 850m Alexandra Garden Trail offers scenic views to cyclists and pedestrians.

Berlayer Creek is one of two remaining mangroves in the south of Singapore.

There are four conserved black-and-white bungalows on Bukit Chermin.

After the bend here, you can spot the majestic buildings of Reflections at Keppel Bay, and admire the luxurious yachts docked at Keppel Marina.

During high tide, schools of fishes can be seen. And during low tide, you can spot seagrass beds and different species of crustaceans on the mudflat.

The 330m Bukit Chermin Boardwalk is elevated on the sea along the coastal foothill of Bukit Chermin.
